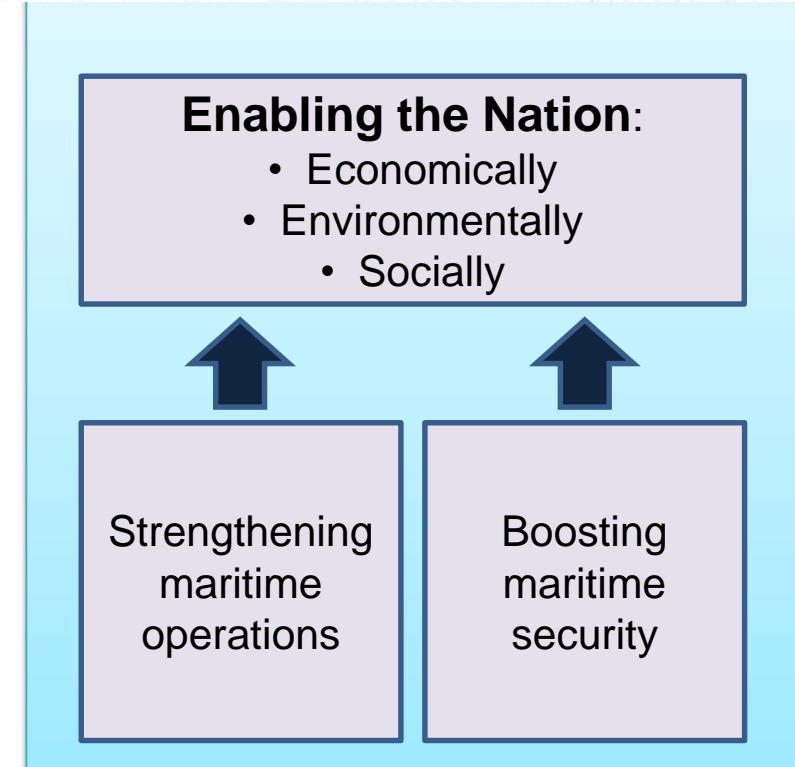

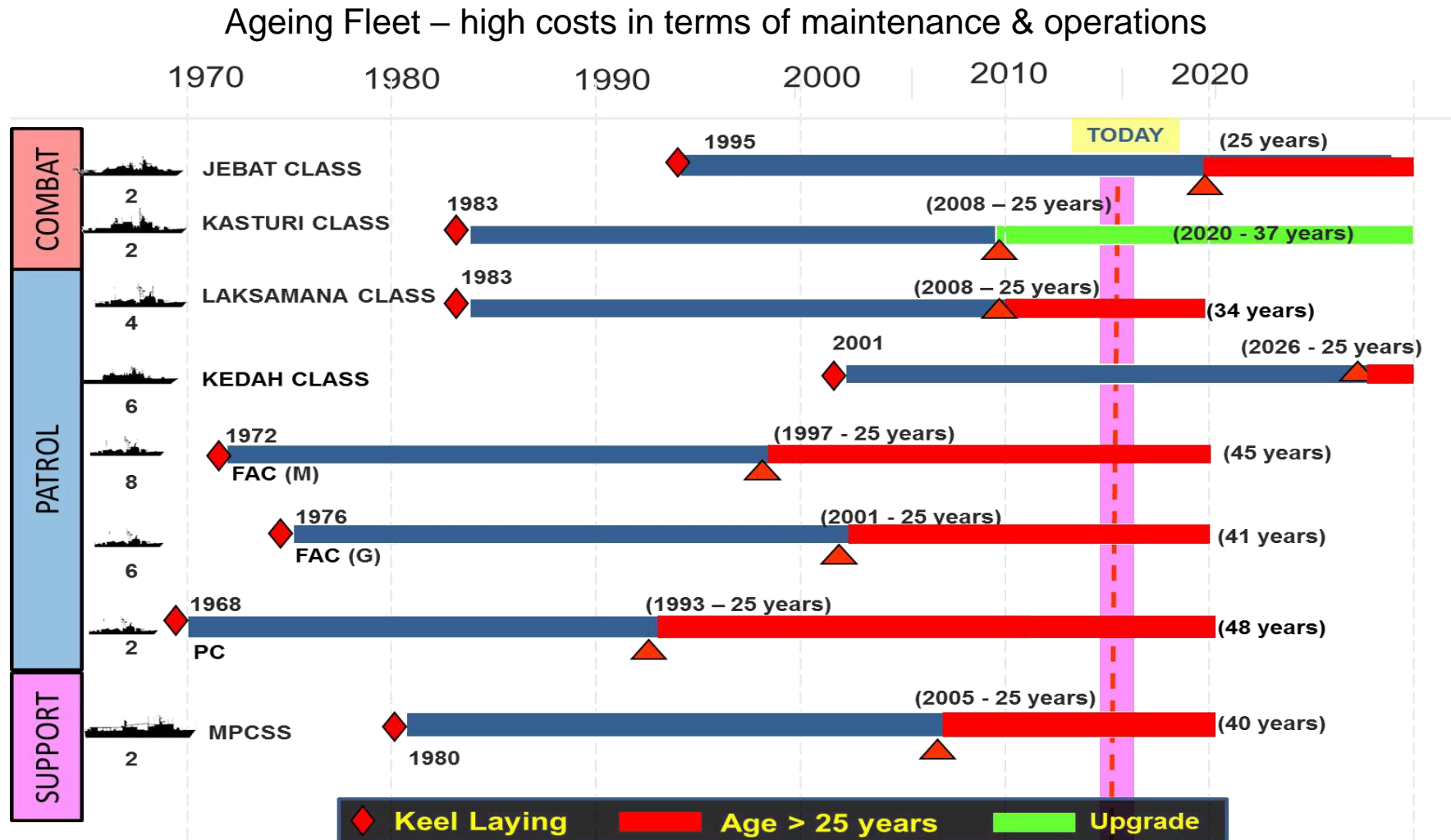

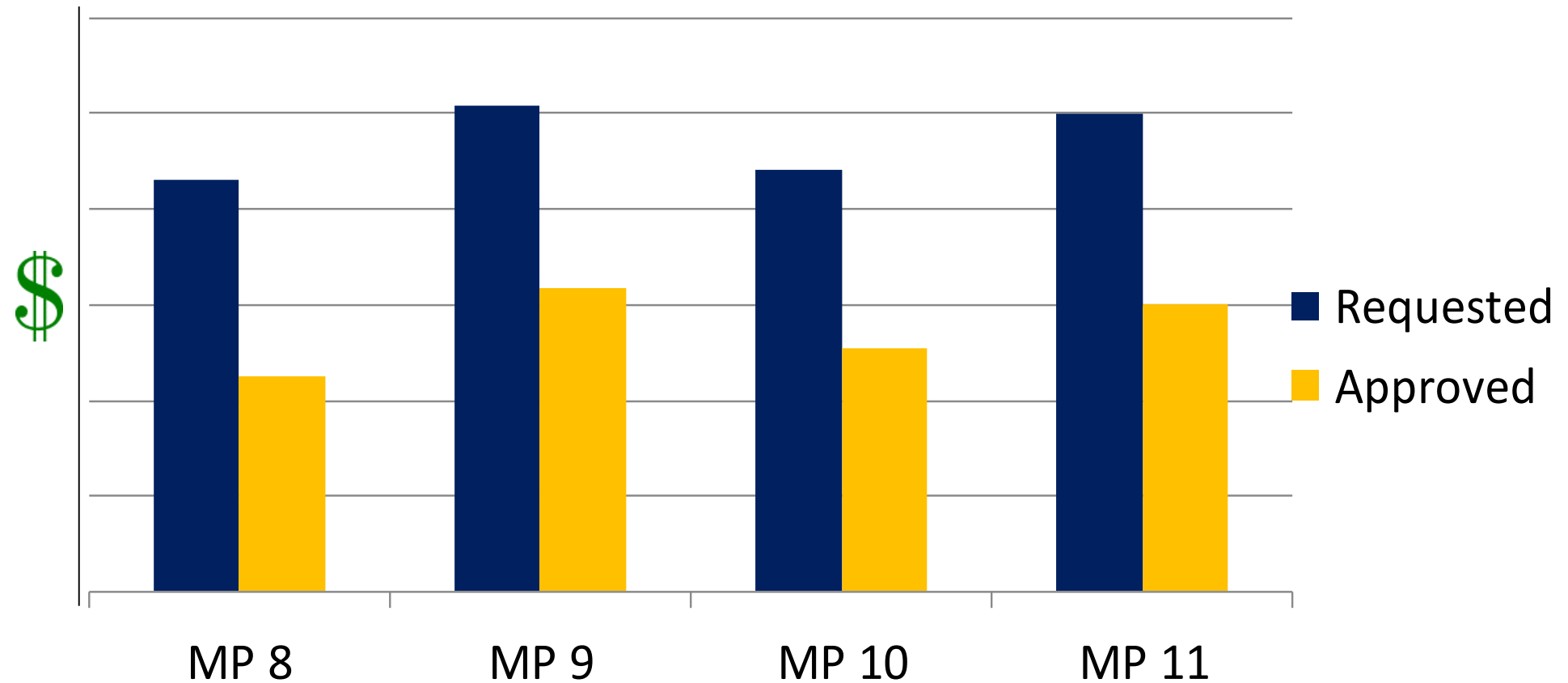
Why #15to5 fleet transformation programme?

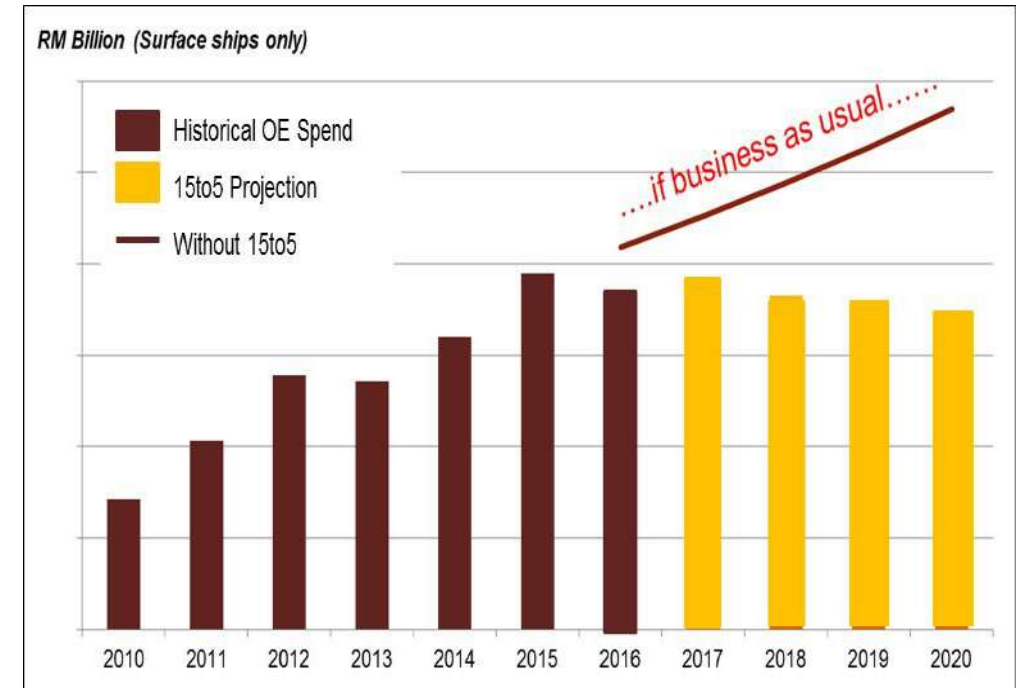
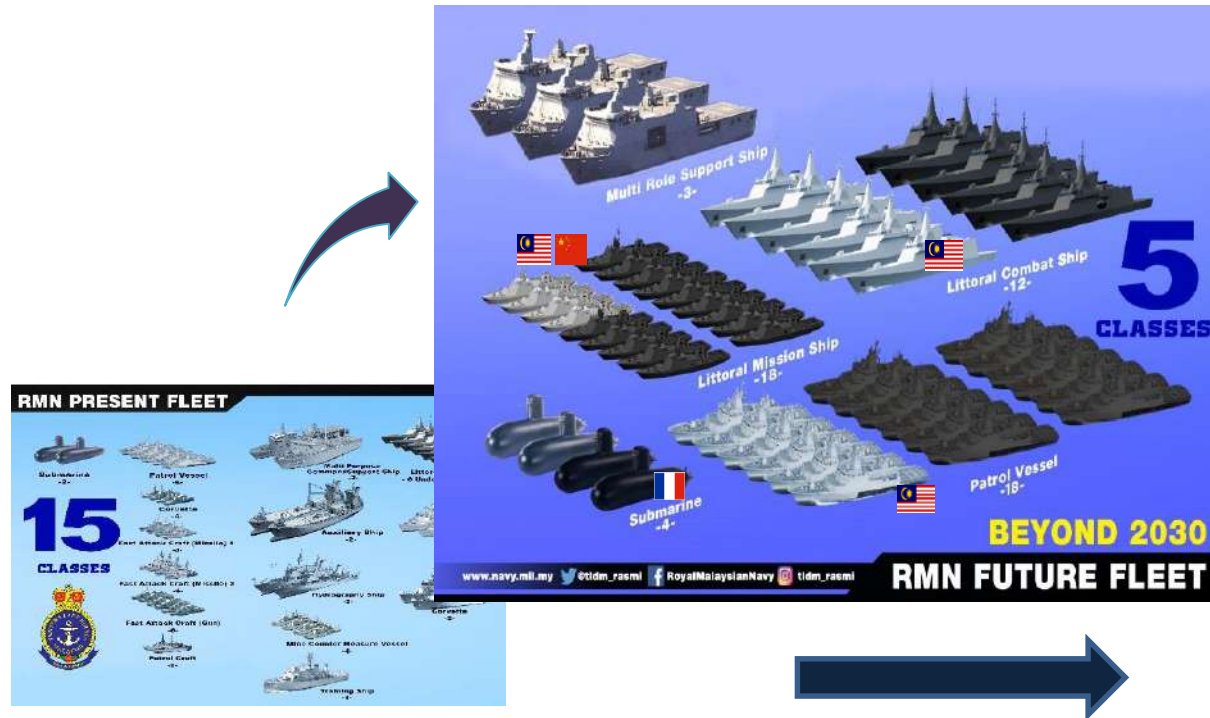

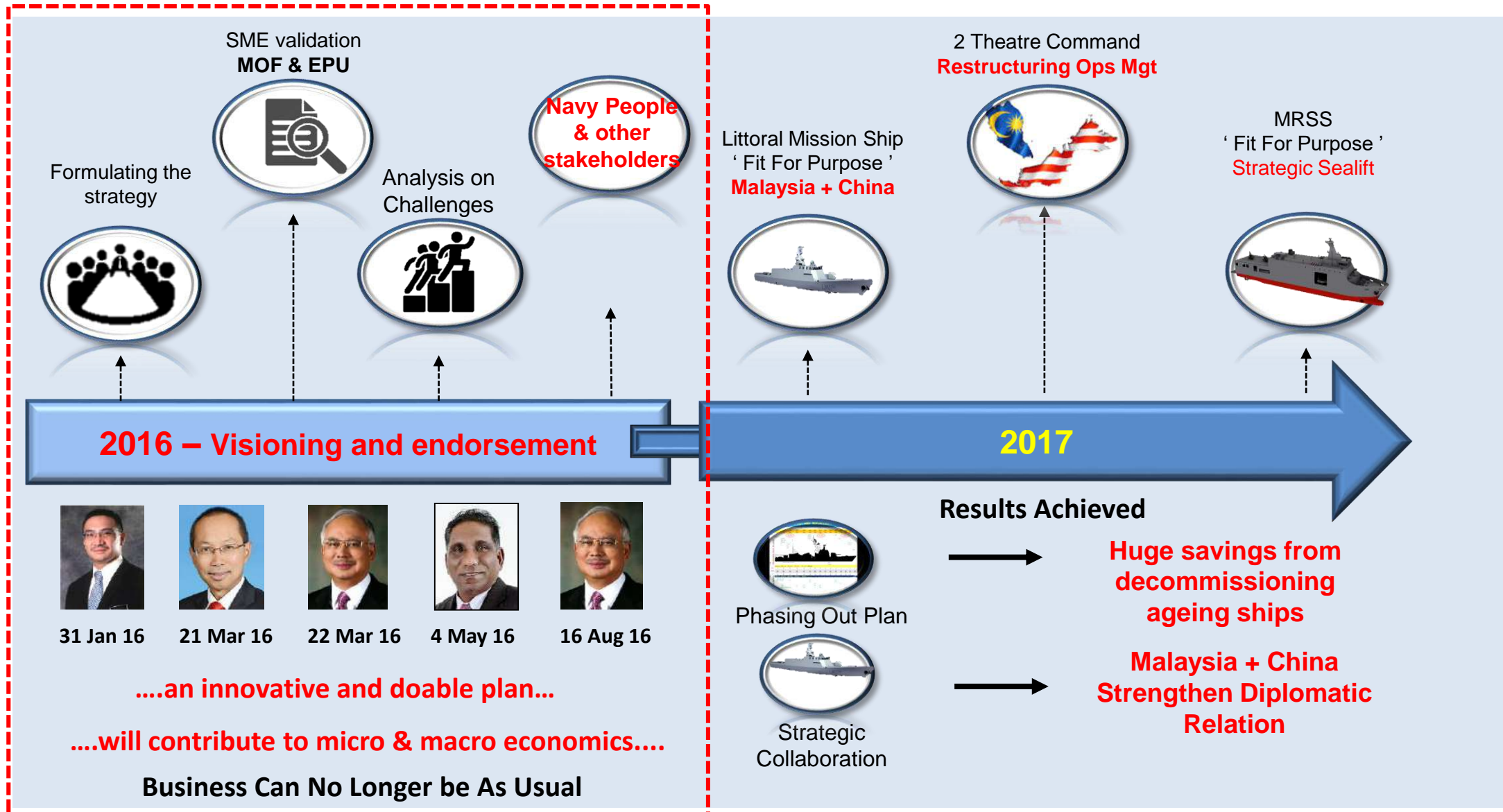
Why #15to5 Fleet Transformation Programme?

Phasing out of the older vessels in the fleet, streamlining and creative optimisation of OE & DE through savings in maintenance and operations cost

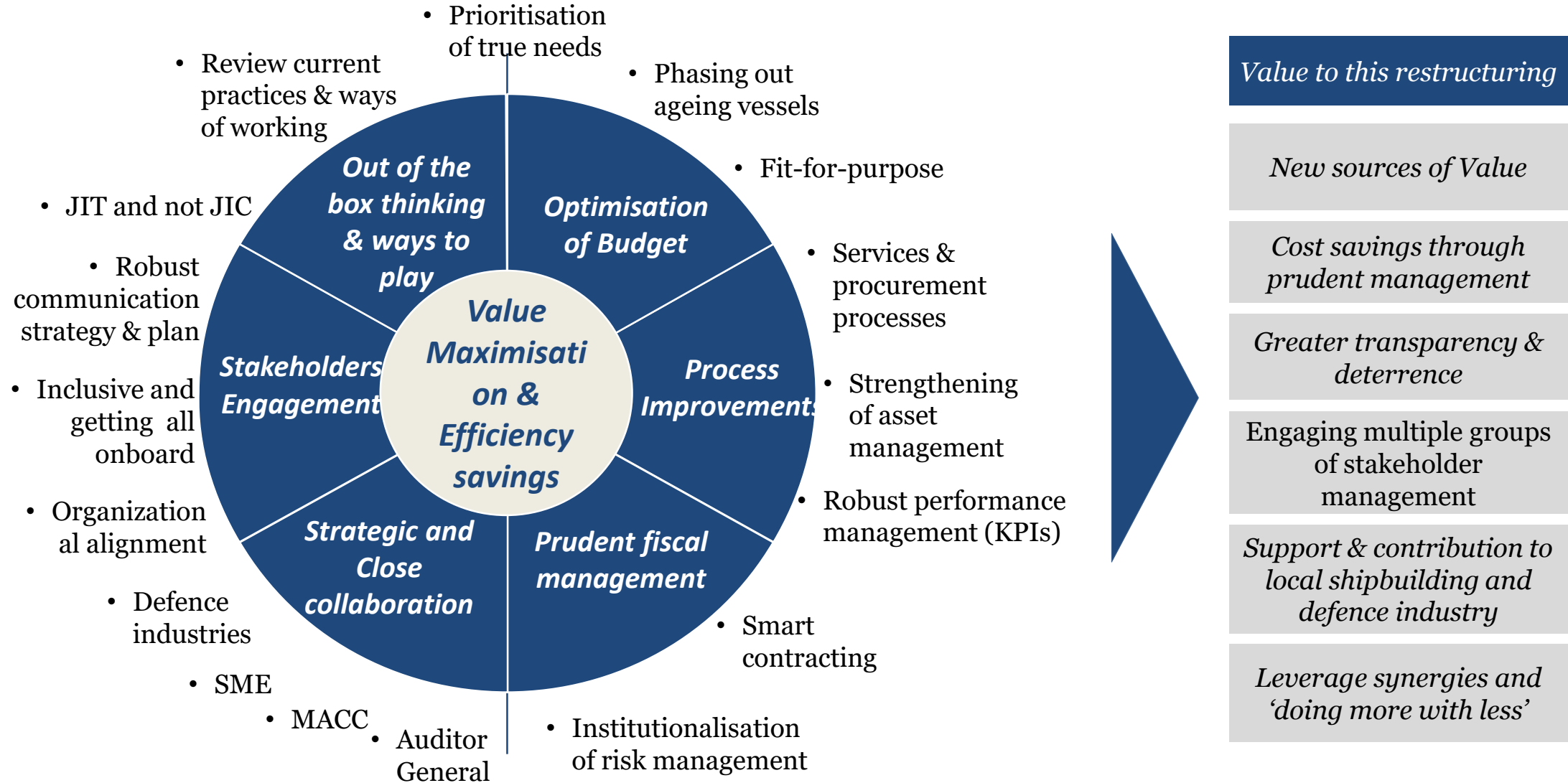


- Potential savings from phasing out older vessels from 15 classes to 5 classes, improvement in asset management and procurement processes as well as optimisation of approved budget

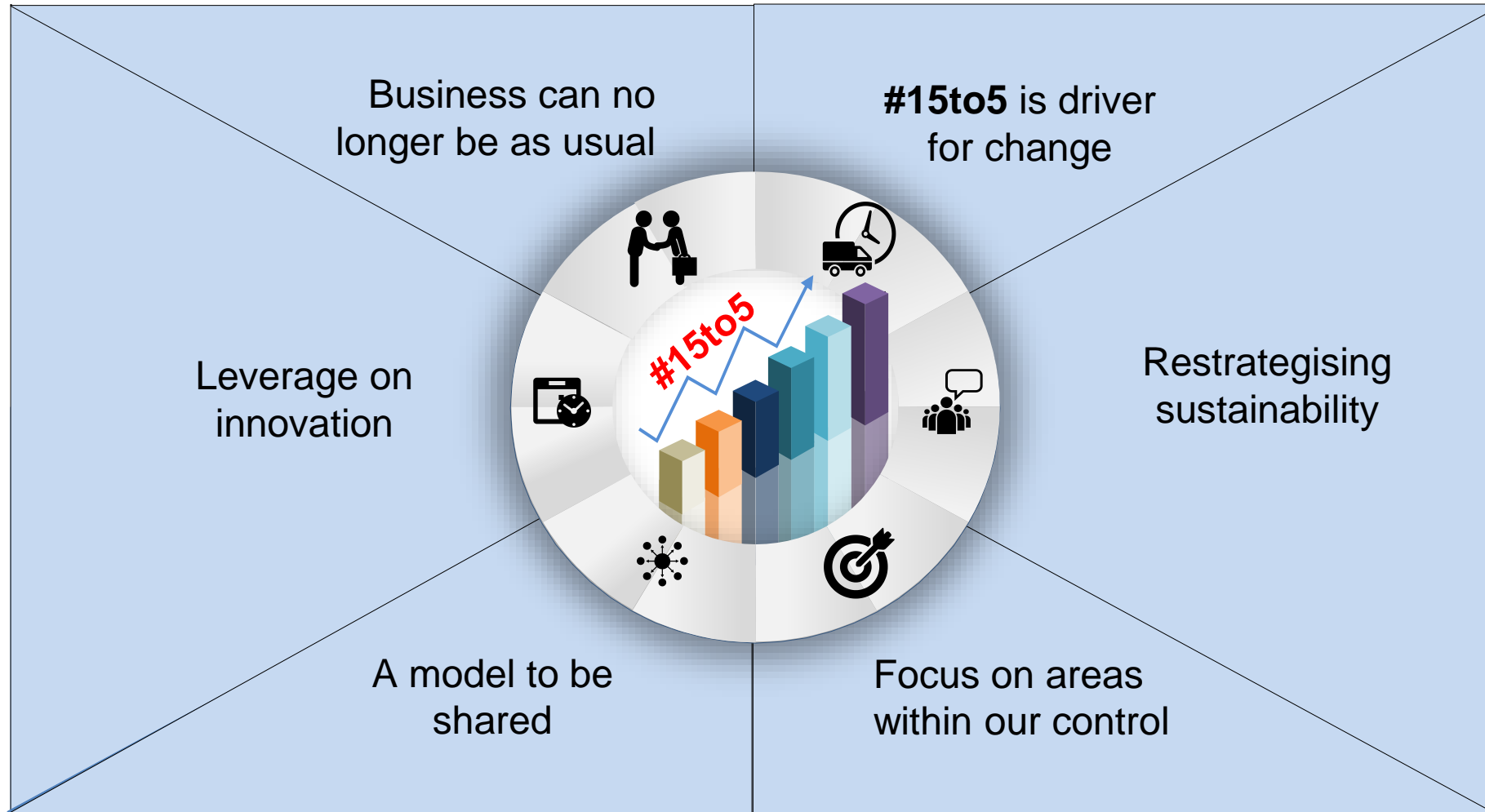
